Features of the Midi Library

- **Overview:** This midi library provides midi sound files (.mid), with melody and harmony chords (.mid format).
- **Midi Format:** The music files in this library are Type 1 midi files (Musical Instrument Digital Interface), an industry-standard format used on electronic musical keyboards and PCs for computer control of musical instruments and devices.
- **SATB:** The fully-voiced SATB settings as found in the pew hymnal are not included in this midi library due to copyright restrictions.
- **Player Software:** Midi player software must be installed on your computer in order to listen to midi files on your sound card and speakers. If you surf the web regularly for music files, you probably already have a midi player installed on your computer.
- **Instrument:** By default, the midi files in this library produce sound using midi channel 20 'Church Organ' (channel 19, if numbering starts at 0 on your player). The instrument assignment can be changed using midi editing software.
- **Midi Editing:** You can edit the midi performance (tempo, key, notes, instrument, etc.) using a midi editor. Both free and purchased midi editing software is widely available on the web.
- **Keyboards & Organs:** Many electronic keyboards and organs with a disk drive or USB reader can play midi files copying the midi file onto a floppy disk, CD, or USB drive. Be sure to verify that your instrument can read Type 1 midi files by downloading one of our free samples prior to your purchase and testing the playback on your instrument.

Installation

- **ZIP install:** If your library was delivered in a ZIP file, unzip the contents of the zip file to any folder on your hard disk, then click the file *index.html* to open the library in your browser. The library will not function if the files are opened directly from the ZIP file.
- **CD/DVD install:** If your library was delivered on a CD or DVD, insert the disk into your drive and Windows will automatically open the library in your browser; alternatively, click the file *index.html* to open the library.
- **USB install:** If your library was delivered on a USB drive, insert the drive into a USB port and click the file *index.html* in the root folder to open the library in your browser.
- **Online:** If you purchased online access for your library, there is no installation required; simply use your browser to access the media content on the web.
- **Hard Disk install:** You may copy the files onto your hard disk for convenient access and faster response; copy all the files and the entire folder structure intact.
- **Media access:** Direct access to the individual midi files is supported by directly opening the *midi* folder inside the root folder of each hymnal's installation.
- **Uninstall:** The library may be uninstalled by simply deleting all the files.
- Depending on how your specific purchase is packaged and delivered, some of these installation methods may not apply to your purchase.

System Requirements

- Use *Internet Explorer* or *Firefox* browsers on Windows; use *Safari* on Macintosh and iPad.
- Midi player software is required to play the midi files on your computer; free players include Apple's *QuickTime* and Microsoft's *Windows Media Player*.
